The city Donostia – San Sebastian hosted the <u>ECOMM 2009</u>. The main themes for European Conference for Mobility Management were Evaluation and Cost benefits. With more than 400 delegates it was the best attended ECOMM ever. The delegates attended sessions, workshops, plenary sessions and technical visits in San Sebastian and the nearby City of Bilbao.

Over 60 speakers have been allocated to 28 parallel sessions and interactive workshops to share practical experiences on all aspects of Mobility Management, including:

- Urban Planning
- Winning back public spaces / Local Access
- The Renaissance of Cycling
- Health
- Leisure / Tourism

The ECOMM 2010 will take place in Graz, Austria. The city is World Heritage City since 1999 and was the European Cultural Capital City in 2003. Graz is an

advanced Mobility Management city: first pedestrian zone in 1970, city focused on tram, the first city with a speed limit 30 on ALL non priority roads since 1992 and the first Austrian mobility center since 1997.

The conference will be a unique cooperation between the Austrian Federal Ministry for environment, the Regional Styrian Government, Department for Transport and the City of Graz.

Topics in Graz will be:

- Mobility Management in historical city centers
- · Mobility Management for new districts
- · Cross linking of districts and regions
- · Mobility Management for all generations and genders
- · New forms of Mobility Management
