Kista Science City has since 1986 been developed to its world leading position in mobile technologies, in a triple

helix collaboration managed by the Electrum Foundation. During the excursion, you will be presented to the Urban ICT Arena open digital testbed and collaborations arena, today with more than 40 partners and 60+ projects aiming to create solutions for the sustainable and connected city. One of the projects that we will show is "Autopiloten", the first test of autonomous vehicles on public roads in Scandinavia.

Uppsala Castle

The exclusive Gala Dinner on Thursday evening will take place in the castle of Uppsala. The castle is one of Uppsala's main landmarks. Its location on Kasåsen makes the castle visible from afar. The construction of Uppsala Castle begun in 1549, and was initiated by Gustav Vasa. Several major historical events have taken place inside the castle walls, including the Sture murders in 1567, Queen Kristina's abdication in 1654 and several coronations, the last of which was Ulrika Eleonoras in 1719.

Land Use Planning has a very strong influence on the mobility behavior of future residents, as land use plans determine density, use mix and space for traffic infrastructure. Building permits cas define certain obligations for developers, e.g. co-financing of traffic infrastructure or the amount of parking provided and thus further influence mobility behavior of future users. This ca. 2 hours audience engaging, interactive training session will provide a good overview over the connections between land use planning, managing mobility and SUMP, and show some very useful examples.
